<p>The initial event was organized with 17 professionals, coming from the youth work sector. These individuals are actively engaged in direct work with young people, focusing on areas encompassing personal development, empowerment, democratic values, and media literacy. Notably, their scope of activities extends beyond national borders, encompassing both national and international initiatives with emphasis on non-formal education. Of the 17 participants, two were experts in the topic of media literacy, as they have extensive experience in organising training sessions in national and in international level addressing the critical issue of fake news.</p> <p>The programme of the event was the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Description			
<i>Provide a short description of the event and its activities.</i>			
<p>The last event was organized in an online format with 98 professionals from all over Greece with different academic backgrounds mainly coming from the field of education and journalism. The event was organized on the occasion of International Day of Democracy (15th of September). The agenda of the event was slightly differentiated, from the one in the in-situ events, as external experts who have studied thoroughly Mediawise research report, were invited to present the main results and initiate an open dialogue on the topics of fake news and the role of journalists as well as the effects of AI on democracy. Following the insightful presentations, participants delved into an open discussion regarding the recommendations stemming from the survey results. Particular emphasis was placed on the intergenerational dimensions of the project, highlighting the importance of involving individuals of different age groups in addressing the challenges of media literacy and fake news. The conversation also explored a spectrum of potential activities that could be organised in the realm of media literacy and the fight against fake news.</p>			

The decision to host this event online was motivated by the strong interest expressed by professionals across Greece in engaging in an open dialogue centred around the Mediawise project. The virtual format facilitated broader participation and knowledge exchange, allowing experts from various regions to come together despite geographical distances.
